## Town of Castle Hill Municipal Forest

The town of Castle Hill owns approximately 7350 acres of land. The land was acquired over time, primarily through tax liens, and the acres were added to the so-called school block, leading to the current total

The land base is largely timbered, is roaded for access, contains the septage disposal site for three towns, is a source of gravel for town use and/or sale, provides significant open space and recreational opportunity for the town and surrounding communities, provides for significant wildlife habitat and is a significant source of income to the town, offsetting potential property tax increases.

The land base is currently managed as a commercial forest. Professional forest land management services are provided by Prentiss & Carlisle: Company Inc.
