

CASTLE HILL POLICY FOR TREE STANDS
TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON TOWN LANDS

In agreement with Laws adopted by the State of Maine, the Selectmen of the Town of Castle Hill hereby adopt the following guidelines for tree stands on Town Property:

It is unlawful to insert any metallic or ceramic object into a tree on land of another for the purpose of erecting a ladder or tree stand. Verbal or written permission must be obtained from the landowner (or representative) to erect and use a portable or permanent tree ladder or stand and the ladder or stand must be plainly labeled with a 2-inch by 4-inch tag identifying the name and address of the person or persons authorized by the landowner to use the stand or ladder. All ladders or stands must be removed by the beginning of the 10th day following the close of the hunting season.

A list shall be maintained at the Town Office of those persons who have permission to construct a tree stand on Town Lands. The list shall contain the name, address, and phone number of those individuals and the location of the tree stand.
